



# Denver Plan 2020

## Goals Report

[The Denver Plan 2020](#) was the Denver Public Schools five-year strategic plan from 2015-2020. With the vision of *Every Child Succeeds*, the plan outlined five goals designed to close academic achievement gaps and prepare all students for success in college and career.

### Great Schools in Every Neighborhood

**Goal:** By 2020, 80% of DPS students will attend a high-performing school, measured by region using the district’s school performance framework.

### A Foundation for Success

**Goal:** By 2020, 80% of DPS third-graders will be at or above grade level in reading and writing, lectura and escritura.

**Data Context:** After the 13-14 school year, Colorado transitioned to a new state assessment, [Colorado Measures of Academic Success in order to align with the more rigorous Colorado Academic Standards and Common Core State Standards](#).

## Ready for College & Career

**Goal:** (a) By 2020, the four-year graduation rate for students who start with DPS in ninth grade will increase to 90%.

**Data Context:** In 2007, new legislation shifted Colorado's graduation requirements policy for high school graduation. Starting with the graduating class of 2021, DPS and districts across Colorado transitioned to new graduation requirements that go beyond typical grades and time spent in classrooms to focus on 1) individual career and academic plans 2) coursework and 3) competency: students ability to demonstrate skills and content they've learned in school in the real world.

**Goal:** (b) By 2020, we will double the number of students who graduate college and career-ready, as measured by the increasing rigor of the state standard.

## Support for the Whole Child

**Goal:** By 2015, a task force, including DPS staff, community partners and city agencies providing services to DPS students, will recommend to the Board of Education a plan to measure this goal and track progress.

**Data Context:** The Whole Child survey was developed to measure progress against this goal. These results are from the Social-Emotional Learning Index from the Whole Child survey that is now a part of our Your Voice/Tu Voz student survey.

## Close the Opportunity Gap

**Goal:** By 2020, DPS will increase both the four year graduation rate and the third grade reading and writing proficiency rate for African-American and Latino students by 25%.

**Data Context:**

Due to the transition in [state assessment to CMAS](#), the data we report here is based on 2015 CMAS results.
